MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE PLANNING AND CONSERVATION COMMITTEE HELD ON 10th FEBRUARY 2020

- **<u>6.</u> <u>Minutes</u>**: The Minutes of the meeting held on 13th and 30th January 2020 were taken as read and signed as being a true record
- 7. Matters Arising:
 - a. Enforcement matters: Updates were given
 - b. <u>Notice Boards</u>: This had been discussed at Full Council and repairs will be actioned
 - **Blind House**: An application to be made to English Heritage for the work to the stonework and to the repairs to the toilet. Clerk to obtain quotation for making a new toilet lid. The quotation for the repairs to the stonework by Marcus Mitchell in the sum of £380 had been accepted.

- d. <u>Risk Assessment:</u> To be reviewed again shortly
- e. <u>Bus shelters</u>: The guttering on the shelter by The Bassetts had come down in the strong winds. Mr Walton had offered to supply an oak board to replace the fascia board which is rotten. His offer was accepted.
- e. <u>Settlement boundary review</u>: Waiting the outcome of the consultation
- f. <u>Neighbourhood Plan</u>: Reply received from Wiltshire Council re the Housing Allocation numbers and this will be discussed by the Steering Group at its meeting on Tuesday 11th February. Cllr Botterill stated that, following the results of the recent survey, the Steering Group needs to look at items in detail. He has drafted a document for discussion at the next meeting.
- g. Late publication of Planning Notices; This had been discussed at Full Council and it was suggested that the Parish Council could display the green notices. A reply had been received from Wiltshire Council stating that they would not encourage this as having to put up a site notice spurs officers on to an early visit of the site. Wiltshire Council occasionally get questioned by neighbours and those who subsequently make complaints about applications weeks later and whether a site notice was displayed – if they do they have the evidence preserved on file for any subsequent questioning. Also as a local planning authority it has more powers to do these things and handle any subsequent complaints.

- <u>Dickens Gate development</u>; It had been reported that a refuge had been installed on the B3109 near the new Dickens Gate development although the planning application showed a pedestrian crossing. This had been raised with the Planning Officer who was investigating.
