- **<u>6.</u> <u>Minutes</u>**: The Minutes of the meeting held on 9th and 26th April 2018 were taken as read and signed as being a true record.
- 7. Matters Arising:
 - a. <u>Enforcement matters</u>: Clerk gave updates on all enforcement matters

- d. <u>**Risk Assessment</u>**: A new format for Risk Assessments had been agreed.</u>
- e. <u>Settlement boundary review</u>: Waiting update on the present position.
- f. <u>Verge at Prospect</u>; The Wiltshire Highways Enforcement was pursuing this. The property had been sold and Wiltshire Council need to regularise the licence for the useage. Mrs Parker is chasing this.
- g. <u>Wiltshire Core Strategy Review</u>: On-going
- h. **Neighbourhood Planning workshop**: To be discussed further at the next meeting.

8. Correspondence:

a. <u>Affordable Housing</u>: Clerk had circulated letter and map from Ben Anderson. It was agreed to ask Wiltshire Planning officer what the cost of an affordable house would be in Box and also to query why the contribution from the Real World application had been for 10% affordable housing and not 30%

- **b.** <u>**CIL allocation**</u>: Guidance for Parish and Town Council on CIL funds had been circulated to the Committee. There is S106 money due from the application at the Oscar Windebank site and the Clerk to write stating that this must come to Box and the proposal for the money would be a fitness trail on the Recreation Ground.
- c. <u>Councillors Briefing Note 349: Changes to Planning Legislation</u>: This had been circulated to the Committee. It outlines new proposals re the introduction of "permission in principle" which would include the use of Brownfield sites.
- d. <u>Councillors Briefing Note 339: Publication of Wiltshire council's</u> <u>Brownfield Land Register</u>: This outlines details of what would be classed as Brownfield land.
- e. <u>Increased use of Cladding</u>: Reply received from Chris Marsh stating that the increase in the use of this material is likely due to cost and ease/speed of installation. In planning terms, there is no firm rule and design policy is intended to avoid being too dogmatic about the use of specific materials. Each case is considered on its merits and there will be cases where cladding is appropriate and others where it is not. The key advice would be that the materials should be "sympathetic" which is not a synonym for "matching" and does probably rule out any blanket restriction. With regard to the increase in the risk of fire he has replied that in all likelihood the structural fabric of buildings/extensions (and thus surfaces adjoining most sources of ignition) would be substantively the same whatever the external finish. It would also depend on the means of fixing etc as to how quickly a fire would spread once established.
