Creation of car parking area – previously unused grass bank

After discussion it was agreed that a further objection be lodged stating that the proposed depth of the car parking area would be inadequate and would not allow cars through.

Conservatory extension to rear elevation

Letters of objections received from neighbouring properties stating the green notices advertising the application had been late being displayed and had not been put up until after the Committee had considered the application. The Clerk confirmed that the procedure for the Committee had been followed and the Agenda had been published on the website and on the notice boards. By stating that the Council had "no objections" does not mean that they had received no objections to the applications but is expressing the opinion of the Committee.
