The Council's strong objections still stands. It is not just the siting of the building but the design is not in keeping with the Grade II Listed

building which is in the Green Belt and AoNB

7. Items of report:

- a. Wall at The Hermitage: Letter received from the Listed Buildings Officer stating that the initial work to the wall was the structural retaining wall which needed to be approved by Highways Structures. This was confirmed on the 9th June as being OK. Wiltshire council now has to approve a sample panel of the natural stone facing to the wall. Once this has been approved the builders can complete the facing stone wall and the traffic management system can be removed. Clerk to report to the Listed Buildings Officer that the wall appears to be moving where the rods had been put in.
- b. <u>The Ley</u>: It was reported that someone was using a professional saw constantly in the Ley causing a noise nuisance
- c. <u>Roof tiles at Cross Keys, Corsham</u>; it was reported that the tiles had been removed to allow repairs to be carried out.
